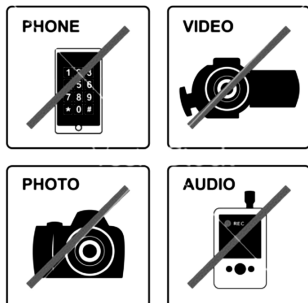
ABOUT NOCARA

Northern California Anti-Racist Action (NoCARA) emerged in response to increased white supremacist activity across Northern California in 2016, from Sacramento to the Bay Area. In organizing for the mobilization, crews of anti-fascists and anti-racists from all over Northern California were brought together to form NoCARA.

NoCARA Goals Include:

- *Building a regional capacity for self-defense against fascism, patriarchy and white supremacy*
 - *Combating and contesting white nationalist, right-wing extremist and Neo-Nazi groups and their ideals, as well as the forces of structural white supremacy and patriarchy that these groups seek to defend and uphold*
 - *Creating a movement and culture of resistance that new people can come into and engage with, as we in turn build power and capacity for positive change within our own communities*
